An excellent, comprehensive reference considered by many to be the "gold standard" of internal medicine textbooks. Makes excellent use of tables, graphs, illustrations, and radiographs. Not for quick reference, but rather for in-depth home reading on specific topics. Requires serious concentration and reading time, but provides some of the most thorough reviews of disease processes that one can find. A great reference for those considering internal medicine as a career. Available as a single- or double-volume text. The new edition is in full color and provides free Web site access to cases, a test bank, and an image library.

McGraw-Hill, 2005, 44th ed., 1880 pages, ISBN 0071390065

A clinically oriented reference that is concise yet detailed and highly readable for medical students. Well organized with excellent descriptions of pathophysiology, clinical findings, and treatment. The beginning of each section offers the essentials of diagnosis. The text is revised annually and thus offers useful tables and up-to-date references. Includes more thorough coverage of ambulatory care than that found in more conventional textbooks.

A⁻***The Merck Manual of Diagnosis & Therapy*****\$40.00****BEERS**

Merck, 1999, 17th ed., 2833 pages, ISBN 0911910107

Offers clear discussions of a wide variety of diseases, but with limited tables, charts, and illustrations. Well organized, comprehensive, and well indexed. May be used as a reference book, but not as extensive as *Harrison's*. Useful as an adjunctive, quick home-reference textbook.
